I wish the outgoing students of MIT all the very best in life.

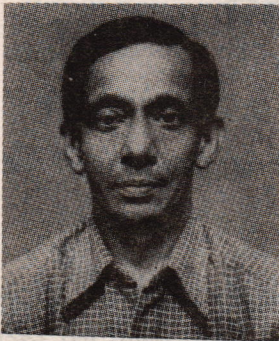

ANNUAL REPORT 1992-1993

1. STUDENTS

1.1 Students Strength

The total strength in B.Tech. and M.E. courses is 740, out of which 85 are girls (11.5%). The total number of students admitted during the year 1992-93 is 270, out of which 29 are girls (10.7%).

There are 19 students studying at M.I.T. from States other than Tamil Nadu.

(Andhra Pradesh - 7, Karnataka - 4, Kerala - 3, Pondicherry - 2, Madhya Pradesh - 1, Maharashtra - 1 and Uttar Pradesh - 1.

There are 12 candidates working for Ph.D in different disciplines, out of which 3 are girls.

The total number of outgoing students in B.Tech. is 179 out of which 23 are girls. In M.E. it is 65, out of which 9 are girls.

1.4 Sports

This year activities started with the teams participating in the inter-collegiate Betram Tournaments and I.I.T. sportsfest tournaments. Our Ball Badminton team became the runner-up in the

I.I.T. Tournaments. We became winners in the Anna University Inter-Collegiate Tournaments in the following Games : Shuttle Badminton, Khabbadi, Cricket, Ball Badminton, Runners-Up in Chess, Volleyball, Football and Basketball.

The Anna University Sports Meet was held on 19th and 20th October 1992 at MIT. Dr.N.S.Venkataraman, Director, MIT took the March - past salute and inaugurated the sports meet and Dr.H.Anandkrishnan, Vice Chancellor was the Chief Guest and distributed the awards. Dr.S.V.Ramaswamy, Chairman, Sports Board presided over the function and appreciated the arrangements and good conduct of the Sports Meet.

12 Students represented the Anna University team in various games in the inter-university tournaments this year. The Seshadri Memorial Inter-collegiate Ball Badminton tournament was held on 27th and 28th Feb. 92.

The Annual Sports Meet is to be held on 22nd March 1990.

Mr.S.Sarathy and Miss Sunitha Varghese won the individual Championship for Men and Women respectively.

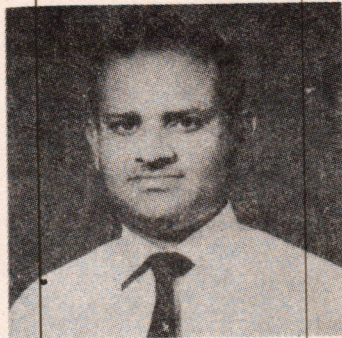
2.7 Training of Non-Teaching Staff

The III year B.Tech Students went on an industrial tour and visited many factories like BAJAJ (Pune), ARAI (Pune), BEML (Bangalore), etc.

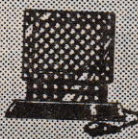
The Association arranged a three day practical training programme by TVS SUZUKI LIMITED in order to update the knowledge of the students on two-wheelers.
